From the Admin Team

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Winterfold Primary School's main governing structure is its School Board. The Board oversees all strategic aspects of school operations and is responsible for overseeing the implementation of our 2018 - 2020 Business Plan. This plan has set improvement targets based upon our school's, and the Board's, careful review of available data in various areas of the school. The Board comprises of five staff, six parents and a community representative. Our Board works extremely collaboratively in order to ensure the best outcomes for all students in the school and sets whole school directions to achieve the targets that are outlined in our Business Plan. The Board is also responsible for endorsing the Voluntary Contributions and Charges requested from our parents each year as well as overseeing various policies and procedures that are in operation at the school. Each Board member brings a different but valuable set of skills to the board meetings and employs their skills to assess, review and set the school's strategic direction. Our Board are indeed a valuable asset to your children, in terms of maximising their outcomes at Winterfold Primary School.

Last Thursday, around 40 of our students went to East Hamilton Hill Primary School to compete in the Interschool Athletics Carnival. Against very stiff competition, our students performed admirably, securing second position overall at the end of the day, and had an excellent time whilst demonstrating a very high level of skills and sportsmanship. Three of our girls won overall champions for their year levels which is an outstanding effort - and our congratulations go to Lilah Sweetman - Year 3, Olivia De Jonge - Year 4 and Aaleah Clifford - Year 5.

A reminder that our Before and After School Procedures stipulate that the only areas students may play on after school are on the top oval, at the big playground at the southern end and the nature play playground. Students using these three areas only must also be closely supervised by parents or carers who hold the duty of care for the students. Please note that students are not permitted to be in or around the school buildings after school, in particular on play equipment, even if they are supervised by parents. We have cleaners who are working, frequently have contractors on site and we often move vehicles for various purposes around the playground areas when the children are not around. Please pay careful attention to this rule and ensure that before and after school play is only on the top oval.

And finally to Wardle Place... This has been a difficult situation for many years. Parents are again reminded that Wardle Place is not a school drop-off zone. Wardle Place is strictly No Standing and there is signage to indicate this. We do not want our parents to receive a fine, however, if you stop your car even for a second you are liable to get an \$80 fine. Parents will need to drop their students in Wardle Street near the footpath where they can walk safely down Wardle Place without cars doing three point turns. Fremantle City Council have promised an increased presence of parking inspectors in Wardle Place and in the last week they have conducted actions on two separate occasions involving six officers. Please stay out of Wardle Place and keep your \$80!
