# Maar Banga Meka-k Five a Fortnight

We will be sharing five Noongar words in the newsletter each fortnight this year. The senior Aboriginal students will lead us through the pronunciation of these at each assembly. Your children can then share them with you at home so we can use them within our school community. Learning Noongar can help us feel more closely connected to country.

kaya = hello / yes
yoowart = no
boordawan = goodbye (later talk)
yanga = thank you
moorditj = strong / solid / good

#### BOONAROO

Second Summer
The Season of Adolescence
The Fruiting
February and March





We are currently in the Noongar season (bonar) of **Boonaroo**. It is the hottest (kaalang) part of the year with very little rainfall. There are warm easterly winds (mar) by day and cooling sea breezes in the late afternoon. This is a good time to be living closer to the coast for the abundant seafood. It is salmon (ngari) and herring season. The chortling magpies (koolbardi) signify the bloodroots (maadja) are ready to be unearthed. **Boonaroo** is the blooming time of the white flowering gums, including jarrah (djara), marri and ghost gums. Traditionally during this time, Noongar people taught their children the art of tool making. The colours of **Boonaroo** are yellow (yoont), orange (yoont-mirda) and red (mirda) which represent the heat.
