#### From the Admin Team

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Our Winterfold students have settled quickly into their learning routines this term, which is a credit to both our families and our teachers. Thank you for having your children prepared and ready for learning; it certainly makes the transition back to school much easier. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank Julie Radford for her leadership last term and her support to make the start of 2023 a seamless transition for all.

Term 2 will be busy with Edu-Dance sessions on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and a concert at the end of the term. ## Learning Noongar can help us feel more closely connected to country...

You have probably noticed the trilingual signage recently installed around the school. The **kwobidak** artwork was created by Noongar artist, Seantelle Walsh. The layout was designed by the **moorditj** Sean Douglas, parent of Roland, May, Henry and Finn. **Yanga** – thanks to Sean for all his hard work! This fortnight we will share about the Noongar way of counting which will help you make sense of the classroom number signs.

keny = one 1

koodjal = two 2

dambart = three 3

koodjal-koodjal = four 2+2 = 4

maar = five 5 & hand (which has 5 fingers)

These numbers are used together to make the bigger numbers.

For example, 9 is maar-koodjal-koodjal and 13 is maar-maar-dambart.

When numbers are too large to represent in this way,

Noongar people say **boola** which means many.



## DJIRAN

First Dew
The Season of Adulthood
April and May



We are currently in the Noongar season of *Djiran*. The weather is becoming cooler, especially at night, with winds from the southwest. Cloud formations increase, morning frost begins and there is occasional rain. During *Djiran*, the hunting is good – there are fish in abundance and the kangaroos have fattened up. *Djiran* is the time of red flowers as seen blooming in the red flowering gum. She-oak trees are producing red seed cones, and banksias are in flower too providing nectar for small mammals and birds. In Noongar culture, this was traditionally the time of marriages and courtship ceremonies.

#### **TREK2School Study**



All students in Year 5 and 6 AND their parent/carer are invited to participate in an important research study

Researchers at the Telethon Kids Institute and the University of Western Australia are working with the WA Department of Transport to understand how children in years 5-6 travel to school, why they travel to school this way and their use of food outlets along the way. 
