

This fortnight's words are the four cardinal directions along with a suffix which will help us to use these words in Noongar language. Learning these will help us better understand the lyrics of Gina Williams' Wanjoo the welcome song which we sing every week at school assemblies

> diiraly = north kongal = south boyal = east marawar = west

-ak = a suffix which means on / in / at / from

For example, marawar-ak means "from the west".

#### **DENTAL SCREENING**

On Thursday, 31 August, the Dental Team from **BEACONSFIELD DENTAL THERAPY CLINIC** will be visiting Winterfold Primary School to carry out Dental Screening of enrolled students in Pre-primary, Year 3 and Year 6 children.

This is a simple procedure where disposable pop sticks are used to retract the cheeks to allow the Dental Officer to see how the teeth have developed. As a result of this, the Dental Officer may request to speak to the Parents/Guardians of some children. In most cases this will be to discuss Orthodontic considerations.

Children whose parents have not given consent for treatment with the School Dental Service will not be examined.

## **AUGUST NEWS**

#### What's up in the garden:

As we near the end of winter, we are enjoying the last of the winter crops and planning for spring in the Annie St Community Garden. We have now passed the Winter solstice and the days are gradually getting longer.

August sees the start of the Nyoongar season of Djilba (first spring) which is a transitional time of year as we experience wet and windy days along with an

increase in warmer sunny days. As the days start to warm up there is a colour explosion, especially with native yellow and blue flowers brightening up native bushland areas.

We had a big push in May to improve the soil in our beds with the incorporation of soil improver, Rooster Booster pellets, and worm castings to add microbes and help the soil thrive. Once the beds settled it was exciting to get some winter crops planted into the enriched soil.

Thanks to all who helped with this enormous task, we are now seeing the benefits of your efforts. It is exciting to see the following vegies and herbs doing well in the garden.



The vegie beds also have numerous flowering plants with the aim to attract bees into the garden to improve the pollination rates as the vegies grow. Currently in flower are Calendula, Marigolds, and Lobelia. We are looking forward to enjoying the Sweet Peas, with their beautiful scented flowers in early spring.
